WELCOME TO YOUR GUARDIAN'S STORIES

Here's where you can find lost story-treasures and enjoy the stories of the Saga (the Bible). See how each story fits together to reveal more about who Jesus is. Find out that the story is still going on now – and that you can be part of it, not just for the few days of the club but for always.

The Bible is split into two sections (the Old Testament and the New Testament). These two testaments are split into books (the Old Testament has 39 books, the New Testament has 27). The books are split into chapters (the biggest

book, Psalms, has 150 chapters!) and those chapters are split into verses (the longest chapter is Psalm 19 with 176 verses!). Sometimes you'l see a Bible verse written like this: ITATTHEW 22:37. Here is how you tell which verse to read:

matthew means we need to look for the **Bible book of Matthew**. If you are not sure where this is, look for the contents page near the beginning of the Bible.

means we need to look for the big number 22; we call it **chapter 22**.

37 means we need to look for the little number 37; we call it **verse 37**.



What happened when the fishermen listened to Jesus and did what he said?


Jesus told Simon, "Don't be afraid! From now on you will bring in people instead of fish."


The fishermen followed Jesus, even though they didn't know where he would lead them.
