The Bible is split into two sections (the Old Testament and the New Testament). These two sections are split into books (the Old Testament has 39 books and the New Testament has 27).

The books are split into chapters and those chapters are split into verses. Sometimes you'll see a Bible verse written like this: **Acts 8:26**. Here is how you tell which verse to read:

Acts means we need to look for the **Bible book of Acts**. If you are not sure where that is, look for the contents page near the beginning of the Bible.

8 means we need to look for the big number 8; we call it **chapter 8**

26 means we need to look for the little number 26; we call it **verse 26**

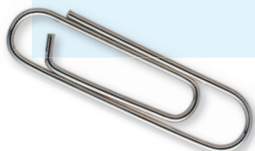



Don't all these who are speaking come from Galilee? ...

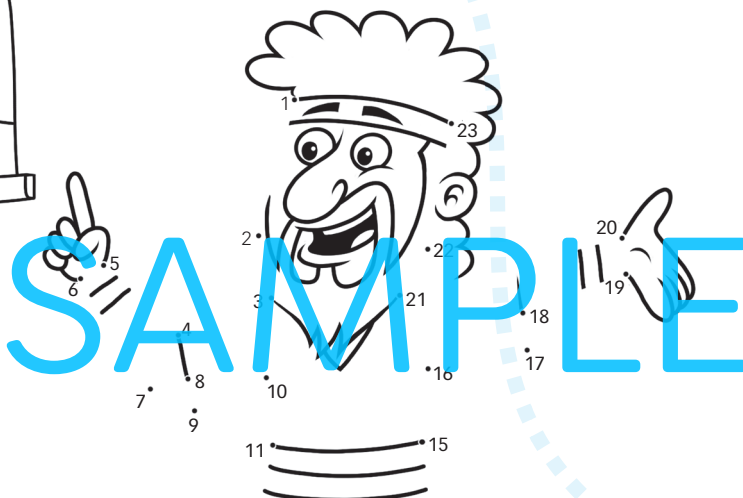
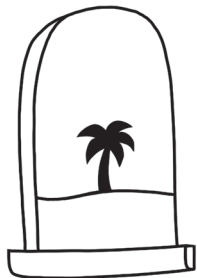
¹¹ ... Yet we all hear them using our own languages to tell the wonderful things God has done.
