BIBLE

Jesus said to the crowd who'd been hungry and were then miraculously fed by him:

³⁷All those the Father gives me will come to me, and whoever comes to me I will never drive away. ³⁸For I have come down from heaven not to do my will but to do the will of him who sent me. ³⁹And this is the will of him who sent me, that I shall lose none of all those he has given me, but raise them up at the last day. ⁴⁰ For my Father's will is that everyone who looks to the Son and believes in him shall have eternal life, and I will raise them up at the last day.'

John 6:37-40

Reflect and pray

- Read verses 1 to 36 as the context for this short passage. Jesus feeds five thousand, walks on water and describes himself as the bread of life – the only One who can permanently satisfy spiritual hunger.
- Now read verses 37 to 40 again, and let them fill you with thankfulness for what they say about the good news of Jesus.
- 95% of children and young people in England and Wales (The 95) aren't in church. That's around 12 million of them. Picture those you yourself know being welcomed into Jesus' loving embrace (v 37). He won't turn away anyone who comes to him in need. Tell God just how much that's what you want to see happen, for those you know.
- Thank God for his plan for those who come to Jesus to be saved (vs 39,40).

Praying throughout the day

Here are some ideas for how the things you see in everyday life could remind you to pray:



STAIRS

Every time you go up or down stairs, pray for the SU teams as they discern the next steps.



CURTAINS

As you open the curtains and let light into a room, pray for those working with The 95 as they share the good news of Jesus; pray that as the children and young people hear about Jesus, it will be like light flooding in.



PLUGS

When you plug something in, pray for good connections between churches and The 95 in their community, and that those relationships will be life-giving.



SPICES

If you're cooking, use the spices as a reminder to pray that The 95 will be open to exploring the difference Jesus can make, just as herbs and spices make a difference to the flavour of a meal.
